EMPLOYMENT

Laura has appeared in employment tribunals for both applicant and respondent in cases involving unfair dismissal, constructive dismissal, unlawful deduction from wages and disability, race and sex discrimination. Most recently Laura successfully represented the applicant in a two day sex discrimination claim. Laura is a contributor to the Clarendon Chambers Employment Review newsletter.

FAMILY

Laura has gained considerable experience in public law Children Act proceedings whilst on secondment at a Local Authority. She has also successfully acted for the respondent in a contested non-molestation application.

CRIME
